1. Call to Order by Commodore Young.
 - a. Pledge of Allegiance was led by Nancy Langwith.

 - g. Sunshine & Clouds Report:
 - Carol reported that Bobby and Deni Lee could use help with meals, especially dinners. They ask that you call in advance so they can schedule the meals and the visits.
 - Carol also reported on a fundraiser she is coordinating to raise money for the Kingston Food Bank, Saturday night at the Kingston Ale House. She invited everyone to join her and the Parrotheads at the restaurant from 4-7pm.

2. Reports
 - a. Quartermaster – none
 - b. Treasurer - Tom reported that the club is still in the red until the new dues payments come in. However, we are \$1700 ahead of budget. Invoices have been seen via email. Cheryl was the first check received, followed by John. Payment can be made by credit card for an extra \$5 charge.

 - John reported that there were 13 boats at Opening Day in Kingston.

- f. Past Commodore – Butch presented information about RBAW, Recreational Boat Association of Washington. The group represents 30,000 recreational boat owners and has a lobbyist in Olympia on their behalf. Members are asked to help support the organization on their dues renewals. Membership is \$20/year. Butch encouraged club members to join.
- g. Commodore – Steve had several announcements.
 - Steve announced that the club entry in the Seattle Opening Day Parade won second prize.
 - Steve announced the club cleanup day will be Wednesday, June 1st from 10am. Members are asked to come anytime and bring cleaning supplies. He provided a list of the jobs that will need to be done.
 - Steve reported that the last social events had been very profitable for the club.
 - Steve asked for volunteers to water the flowers on the deck. There is a signup sheet on the deck.
 - Steve reported that club parking decals will be distributed with membership cards, and that the port would allow parking in the KCYC stalls anytime with the decal. Parking to commute to Seattle, however, would not be allowed. Members can get more than one decal. New decals will be printed.

- a. Jack Lott made a presentation about Sail Kingston Cove. Last year the group was able to offer sailing lessons to 34 students, ages 8-11. This year they need funds to buy boats for teenagers. To raise money, they asked all club members to distribute letters to their friends outside the yacht club who they think might donate. They need \$10,000 to purchase four used FJ boats. Letters were distributed to the members. Carol suggested reaching out to partnering with the Silverdale YMCA.
- b. Nancy Langwith spoke about the Friday Night Social Event Schedule for the remainder of the year, July thru December.
 - Summer plans are informal with BBQs on the deck. She asked for volunteers to host. The host can either ask people to bring sides and sell burgers for \$5; or ask people to bring their own meat to cook. The Kesters and Lucas' offered to host.
